Level 4/Master Class – For experienced musicians who can play a large repertoire of tunes at dance tempos. Tunes will be taught more quickly with greater attention to style and technique. Advanced accompanists will be integrated with this level.

GENERAL INFORMATION ABOUT ALGOMATRAD 2018

- Workshops/classes will be held at several locations around Richards Landing: in tents on the Centennial Grounds, at the Royal Canadian Legion Hall, and at the Old Town Hall. Breakfast and the Gathering will occur at the Community Tent at the Centennial Grounds. Lunch, dinner, and evening dances will occur primarily at the Royal Canadian Legion Hall across from the Centennial Grounds. Concerts will occur at the Old Town Hall and at the Centennial Grounds.
- Coffee and light breakfast fare will be available for full registrants at the Centennial Grounds each morning.
- AlgomaTrad 2018 is **not a residential camp**. All registrants are responsible for their own accommodation. Camping is available, see below.
- **Camping** is available at the Centennial Grounds in Richards Landing.
 - **Camping registrants 13 and under must be accompanied by parent/guardian.**
 - Please contact us if you are between the ages of 14 and 18 and would like to attend the Camp without a parent/guardian.
 - There is potable water on-site, but there are **no** water/sewage hook ups.
 - Electrical outlets are limited and restricted to light use (no A/C).
 - There are washrooms on-site but no showers. Showers are available at several locations in Richards Landing for a nominal fee.
- CHILDREN 0 TO 3 YEARS are welcome at no extra cost, but there is no specific programming for this age group.
- **The Nicholas Missere Bursary Fund:** is a needs-based bursary fund. Please inquire about availability.
